

# East Midlands job prospects remain high

Employers in the region remain bullish about the outlook for jobs, with the Employment Outlook for the second quarter of 2015 standing +11%. Compared to other regions, this is the second highest regional outlook in the country.

## East Midlands employment snapshot\*

### Average weekly pay

Average weekly pay in the East Midlands is **£504**, which is £64 lower than the national average. This pay rate is 3.3% less than the same period last year.

### Employment

At **74.5%** the employment rate in the East Midlands is higher than the national average, and has seen a 2.1% increase since the same period last year.

### Hiring Outlook


For the second quarter of 2015, the Net Employment Outlook in the East Midlands is **+11%**. This is significantly higher than the National Outlook.

### Unemployment


Unemployment in the East Midlands is currently **4.9%**, which is lower than the national average (5.7%) and the third-lowest region in the UK.

### Market overview

Across our branches in the East Midlands, we have observed a largely candidate-driven market.

Retaining and attracting candidates in the region is becoming increasingly difficult with in-demand candidates finding themselves with a number of opportunities available to them.
