


Employer hiring intentions remain positive

At +12%, the East of England Employment Outlook continues to be well above the national average, with employers optimistic about hiring in the coming quarter.





East of England employment snapshot

Average weekly pay

Average weekly pay is £606, £26 above the national average. The East of England is the third best-paid region in the UK.

Hiring Outlook

For the fourth quarter of 2015, the seasonally adjusted Net Employment Outlook in the East of England is +12% and considerably higher the national Outlook (+4%).

Employment

At **76.8%**, the East of England's employment rate is the second highest in the UK. The current rate has increased 0.4% since the same period last year.


Unemployment

At 4.7%, unemployment continues to be significantly lower than the national average (5.6%). The East of England has among the lowest regional unemployment rates in the UK.

Market overview

There is a rising confidence amongst employers who are looking to grow their workforces, but at the same time, candidates with in-demand skills are increasingly able to pick and choose between multiple job opportunities.
