


Employer optimism subdued in the West Midlands

At 0%, the Employment Outlook in the West Midlands has declined, continuing a trend of falling employer optimism that we have seen over the past year. For the fourth quarter of 2015, hiring intentions amongst employers in the West Midlands are limited.

West Midlands employment snapshot

Average weekly pay

The West Midlands is now the eighth best-paid region in the UK with an average weekly wage of £525, some £55 below the national average.

Hiring Outlook

For the fourth quarter of 2015 the seasonally adjusted Net Employment Outlook in the West Midlands stands at 0%; this is markedly lower than the national average (+4%).

Employment

The rate of employment in the West Midlands is below the national average and stands at 70.7%. However there has been a 0.8% increase in the level of employment since the same period last year.


Unemployment

At 6.0%, the unemployment rate is slightly above the national average and higher than a number of other UK regions. However, the rate of unemployment has fallen 1.7% since the same period last year.



Market overview
