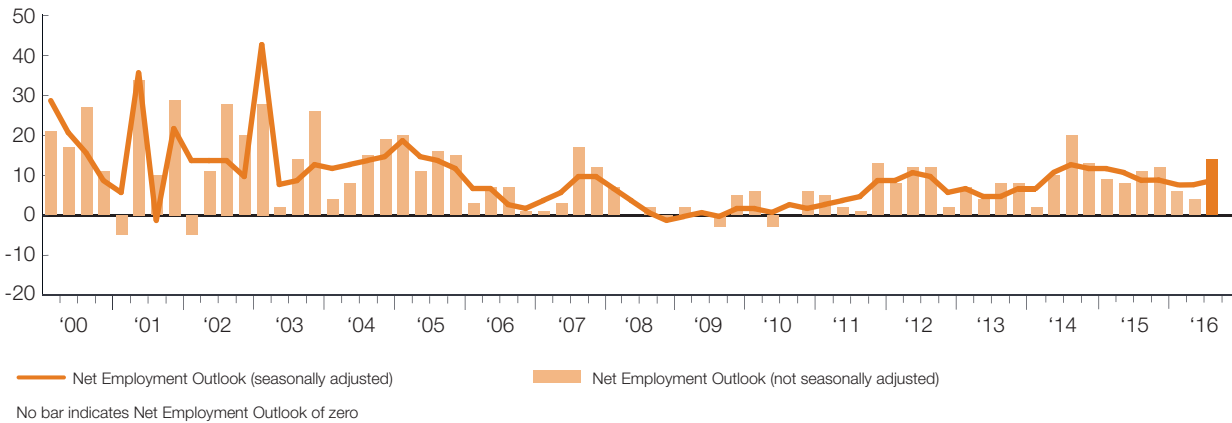


East Midlands employers remain optimistic

With an Employment Outlook of +9%, employers in the East Midlands have modest hiring intentions for the coming quarter and this level of optimism has remained broadly consistent for the past five quarters. In the East Midlands, hiring intentions remain above the national average.

Average weekly pay

Average weekly pay has risen to **£531**, £55 below the national average, making the East Midlands the fifth lowest-paid region in the UK.

Employment

At **74.4%**, the employment rate in the East Midlands is slightly higher than the national average, and has seen a 0.5% rise since the same period last year.

Hiring Outlook

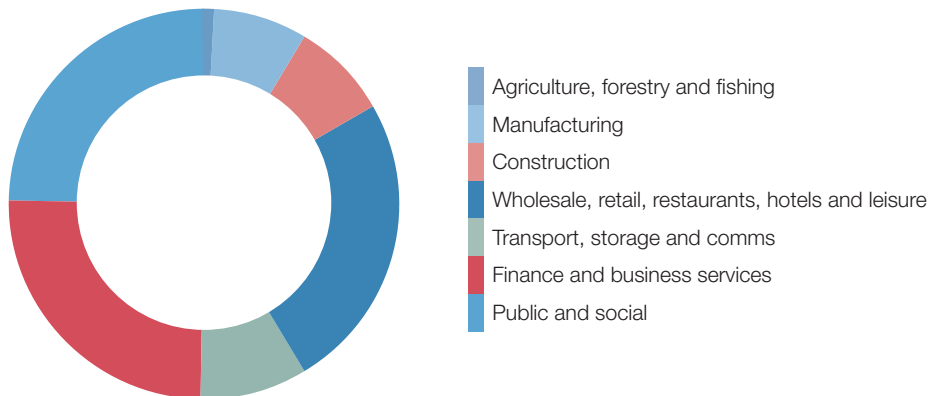
For the third quarter of 2016, the seasonally adjusted Net Employment Outlook in the East of England is **+9%** and higher the National Outlook (+5%).

Unemployment

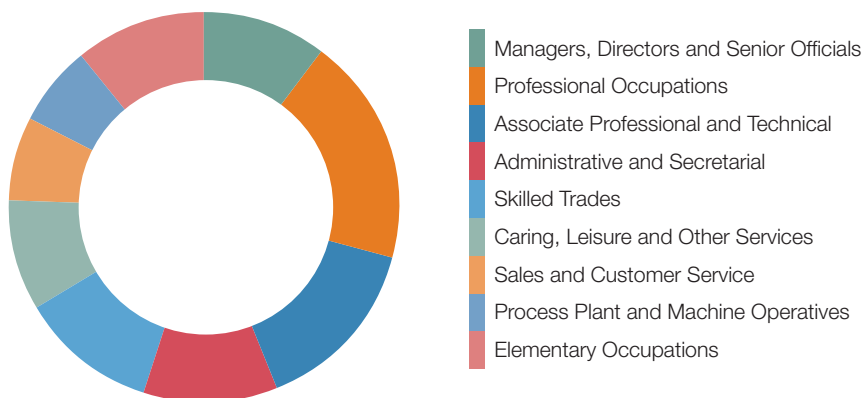
The unemployment rate in the East Midlands is currently **4.6%**, which is lower than the national average (5.1%). The East Midlands has the fourth-lowest unemployment rate in the UK.

Market overview

In the last quarter we have seen the number of temporary job vacancies in decline, particularly in light of the introduction of the National Living Wage and changes to Travel and Subsistence Allowances.
