

Congratulations! You've been nominated by one of our team to join the Manpower Women in Driving Development Pathway – part of our MyPath[®] upskilling programme. We feel you have the strengths, characteristics, drive and personality to be a professional driver and we want to invest in you to ensure you have the necessary tools to advance your career in the Transport and Logistics sector.

At Manpower, we work with organisations, the government and policy makers across various sectors to tackle talent shortages – and Driving is no exception. With an ageing work population (more drivers are retiring from the sector than there are entering it), there is a 60,000 – 80,000 driver shortfall each year. Women in Driving Development Pathway, explained


We've created this programme specifically to encourage and support women in their career transition to fully licenced lorry drivers. As a member of the Development Pathway, you will progress through the established Manpower Driver Academy.

Our Driver Academy is a fully supported training programme with a personalised plan to progress and succeed in your chosen driving qualification. We will support you in developing new skills for a rewarding and exciting career in one of the fastest growing industries in the UK and doing essential work for national and local economies. Upon completion, you will be a fully trained and qualified HGV Driver with the correct skills, knowledge and support to ensure you're confident and job ready.

Programme details:

- LENGTH: 6-8 months (dependent on test centre availability)
- **TIME COMMITMENT:** Part time (you will do your theory in your own time and book tests around work or other commitments); approx. 100 hours total over the full course (including tests, training and support)
- WHERE AND MODE OF STUDY? Remote/On-site tests

The process of qualification is represented by the blue trucks below. Just like taking your car test but a little more involved, we will help you through the process of passing your HGV test. Whilst doing this, we will support you in preparing for the job market and placement opportunities (the orange trucks), in readiness for your career ahead.
